LAINey DIONNE: (4:05-4:35) Lainey Dionne is a Providence based cover artist and singer/songwriter. Her debut record, Can't Refuse - EP, was released in 2016 and is available on iTunes, Spotify, and other streaming services. Can't Refuse- EP is an honest and vulnerable look at love and life through a twenty-something singer/songwriters eyes. In 2018, Lainey was nominated for Best Solo/Acoustic Act, Best Americana Act, and Best College Act at the Worcester Music Awards, along with Best Breakthrough Act at Rhode Island's famed, Motif Music Awards. Lainey's music is inspired by the lyrics and compositions of Gabrielle Aplin, Vance Joy, and The Lumineers. Originally from Smithfield, RI, she has been studying the piano since the age of six, and along the way, has picked up several other instruments including violin, ukulele, harmonica, mandolin, dulcimer, cajon, and guitar. GLENN KENDZIA (of Wild Sun): (4:40-5:10) In just three years, the alternative heartfelt rock outfit, Wild Sun, fronted by songwriter Glenn Kendzia, have earned their stay as one of the most promising bands around. Their debut album, "Little Truths," was released nationally in September of 2015 by American Laundromat Records. Motif Magazine named the album one of the "Top 20 Albums of 2015," alongside Wilco and Kendrick Lamar. This year alone, Wild Sun has been mentioned by Rolling Stone, Spin, Billboard, and Entertainment Weekly, and other high profile press outlets. Wild Sun has a cover featured on the new Elliott Smith tribute, Say Yes among artists like J Mascis, Julien Baker, and Amanda Palmer. DAN BLAKESLEE: (5:15-5:45) With a suitcase of songs, Maine folk troubadour Dan Blakeslee ventured into the subways of Boston in 1995 to practice his craft. He has been making music and art throughout New England ever since, leading him to tour the U.S. performing with The Low Anthem, David Wax Museum, Lydia Loveless, The Lumineers, Liam Finn, Brown Bird, Joe Fletcher, Death Vessel and Kimya Dawson among others. In 2015 his dream of playing Newport Folk Festival became a reality. ROGER WILLIAMS NATIONAL MEMORIAL

282 North Main Street, Providence, Rhode Island



Logo illustration by JoAnna Lapati (www.joannalapati.com) and commemorates Roger Williams, the founder of Rhode Island. Williams, banished from Massachusetts for his beliefs of religious freedom, founded Providence in 1636. The festival is held at the site of the settlement of Providence Plantations founded by Williams. A freshwater spring can be seen in the illustration, this was the center of the settlement. Roger Williams National Memorial was established by Congress in 1965 to commemorate Williams's "outstanding contributions to the development of the principles of freedom in this country."
